The meeting scheduled for 9am will commence with remarks by the Minister of Planning and Sustainable Development, Senator the Honorable Dr. Bhoendradatt Tewarie as well as the Minister of Local Government, Senator the Honourable Marlene Coudray. Secretary General of the ACS, H.E. Alfonso Múnera and Director of Transport and Disaster Risk Reduction of the ACS, Mr. George Nicholson, will also comprise the panel of contributors for the opening ceremony. Ms. Thérèse Marianne-Pepin is also expected to give remarks in her capacity as Chair of the ACS Special Committee for Disaster Risk Reduction.

This Meeting will examine the Draft Agenda presented by the Secretariat, in conjunction with the Chairman, and will address other Procedural Matters for subsequent deliberation.
